This means encouraging children to be active explorers who are not afraid to try out their ideas and to think their own thoughts. Our goal is to help children become independent, self-confident, inquisitive learners, who are able to learn at their own pace and in the ways that are best for them. The child is neither pushed ahead too soon nor held back waiting for the rest to catch up.
