



Goals of our Toddler Curriculum:

The most important goal of our early childhood curriculum is to help children become enthusiastic learners. This means encouraging children to be active explorers who are not afraid to try out their ideas and to think their own thoughts. Our goal is to help children become independent, self-confident, inquisitive learners, who are able to learn at their own pace and in the ways that are best for them.

Montessori Education – Play is an essential part of early learning. As children play they are developing the cognitive, socio-emotional and physical skills they will need to take them into a successful adulthood. They are developing their curiosity, problem solving, intentionality, flexibility, and verbal and non-verbal skills.

Toddlers are encouraged to actively explore, enjoy, see, hear, feel touch and move. They need a world filled with responsive interactions and language-conversations with others, books, songs, and lots of listening and responding to their vocalizations and words. They will work on the beginning fundamentals such as shapes, colors, language skills, social skills, counting, days of the week, name recognition, potty training and the love and exploration of learning.
